She's personally engaged and available, even though traditional methods of meeting are not possible now. Assemblywoman Kamalager hosts or joins virtual panels frequently, like the Anti-Recidivism Coalition forum that addressed the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on women recently released from prison and the 'arts advocacy day' discussion to help arts organizations determine how to maintain funding.

Assemblywoman Kamalager also distributed meals to LAUSD students and their families during school closures as well, showing that there are many ways to be present and supportive.
