"A fundamental aspect of doing the people's work is bringing state resources to the community. It's a responsibility that I take very seriously and one that has been put into sharp focus in light of COVID-19.

This responsibility means responding to every question about unemployment benefits, food assistance, and senior services. It means providing updates at virtual community meetings, board meetings, and townhalls. And, given the need for everyone to stay home, it has meant shifting communications online, connecting with people through social media, email, my website, and on video calls.

Working in the district has given me the opportunity to provide on the ground assistance at a time when it's needed most. I've worked alongside local officials to create a safe shelter for people without homes at the San Diego Convention Center. I delivered food to essential workers at Sharp Memorial Hospital and the San Diego branch of the California Employment Development Department, expressing my deepest gratitude for their endless dedication. And I, along with members of my staff, responded to the severe blood shortage by donating blood at local blood banks in need.

Despite the unprecedented change brought by COVID-19, the work of the California Legislature has continued, because it must continue. Before returning to our districts to help flatten the curve, the Senate provided up to \$1 billion for lifesaving care and COVID-19 related resources. While working from San Diego, I established two Senate committees charged with providing critical legislative oversight of the state's response to the epidemic, and have been in constant collaboration with my fellow Senators, Speaker Rendon, and Governor Newsom.

Managing COVID-19 has been one of the biggest challenges to face our state in modern times, but I have been consistently impressed by the way California's leaders and people have risen to the moment together, while physically apart."

"During this moment of uncertainty, fear, and confusion, it is important for California's leaders to serve with clarity and calm. I consider it a great responsibility to provide constituents with the solutions and support they need to make it through this moment."
