State Senator **Melissa Hurtado**, a CTGCA recruit, introduced a bill (SB 351) to expand the Transformative Climate Communities Program that awards grants for neighborhood-level environmental projects in disadvantaged communities.

In the State Assembly, Assemblymembers Laura Friedman and Lorena

Gonzalez introduced a bill (AB 1080) with several other Democratic colleagues, that would require businesses to reduce single-use plastics in their products.

FORMER REP. ELLEN TAUSCHER

We join many around the state in sadness at California Representative Ellen Tauscher's passing. She died Monday at Stanford Hospital at the age of 67. CTGCA Founder and Tauscher campaign consultant Mary Hughes recalls Tauscher's inspiring spirit: "A lot has been said about the substantive work Ellen accomplished, and it was substantial; but it was her 'Go Big or Go Home' spirit that inspired other women to jump into politics. She had moxy, and she had fun. Her confidence was contagious."
