LENA GONZALEZ'S VICTORY SETS STATE SENATE RECORD



Tuesday, women in California took a huge step toward gender parity when Democrat Lena Gonzalez defeated Republican Jack Guerrero in the SD-33 special election. Lena's election brings female representation in the California State Senate up to 35%, the largest cohort of women in the Senate's history.

As a Long Beach City Council Member since 2014, Lena Gonzalez came into the race with a record of public service. Her <u>core issues</u> include environmental protection, healthcare, and affordable housing.

Each new inspiring, talented, progressive woman legislator gets us one step closer to a California Legislature that reflects the beauty and diversity of our state. Of the 40 Senators serving, 14 are now women and 50% are women of

color. Senate leader President Pro Tem Toni Atkins is the first woman to hold that position. Thirty-seven women out of 120 total members now serve in the legislature. That's 30.8%, tied for the all-time high.
