


## The week ahead: A Hearing. A Vote. A Reckoning.

#### Part II

- <u>AB 300</u> authored by **Assemblywoman Anna Caballero** allows select counties to develop individualized subsidy plans for child care.
- <u>AB 2534</u> authored by **Assemblywoman Monique Limon** requires the creation of outdoor equity grants to ensure outdoor education for all.

- <u>AB 2124</u> authored by **Assemblywoman Blanca Rubio** awards funds to DA's offices that pursue the powers behind human trafficking.
- <u>AB 2070</u> authored by **Assemblywoman Eloise Reyes** requires California colleges to inform students about intimate partner and dating violence.
- <u>AB 3080</u> authored by Assemblywoman Gonzales Fletcher protects and enables employees and independent contractors to speak up about sexual harassment
- <u>SB 945</u> authored by Senator Toni Atkins removes limits on the length of treatment for low-income and uninsured women battling cervical and breast cancer.


