17 winnable target districts now have progressive women running, exceeding our goal of 16 and making it likely that California elects more women to the state legislature in 2016. You can find all the candidates here.

To recap, here are the ctgCA stats:

- 21 viable progressive women candidates in 17 target districts.
- 13 of the 17 districts are open seats that lean blue.
- 4 are swing seats.
- Women now running in 6 of the 7 districts being vacated by progressive women.


