






The share of women by party has shifted. While Republican women have gained ground, women now make up a much smaller share of the Democratic state legislative caucus.

2001: 2016:

% of Republican state legislators who were women:

9%

% of Democratic state legislators who were women:

39%

% of Republican state legislators who are women:

29%

% of Democratic state legislators who are women:

24%

There are currently 17 Democratic women and 12 Republican women in the CA legislature. 7 of the Democrats and 4 of the Republicans are terming out this year. Unless we replace them, we'll be left with an even smaller share of our representatives.

This should be of great concern to progressive women.





New Jersey Governor Chris Christie <u>vetoed a bill</u> extending protections against gender-based pay discrimination. He claimed it would make the state "unfriendly" to business. What about making the state unfriendly to women?

Former Arizona Governor Jan Brewer claimed that "this women thing has gotten way out of control" when asked about efforts to get more women into politics. We'll send her this alert.
