## On Our Way to Parity in the Legislature by 2028

2016 = 1/5 ♀ June, 2018 = 1/4 ♀ November, 2018 = 1/3 ♀ ?

In the past six months, progressive women have won 3 of 5 special

legislative elections.

Wendy Carrillo (AD 51), Sydney Kamlager (AD 54) and Luz Rivas (AD 39) each replaced a male Assemblymember, reversing a decade-long downward trend for women in the CA Legislature and raising women’s representation to 25%.

Now, progressive women are positioned to take 6 more seats currently held by men in the Senate and the Assembly. When successful, these victories will put the California legislature back on the path to gender parity.

*close the gap* CA is working now to maximize the open seat opportunities in 2020 and planning for the bonanza of open seats that will follow redistricting in 2022. With the term limit-dictated exits of most legislators in '24, '26 and '28, gender parity in the Legislature is within reach.
