What difference do women legislators make? A big one! Here's **Part One** of our two-part September Report on our favorite bills that progressive women have successfully carried through the Legislature this past session!

For women, families and children:

- AB 1810 authored by Assemblywomen Eloise Reyes and Laura
 Friedman would require the Exchange to develop options for providing
 financial assistance to help low- and middle-income Californians access
 health care coverage
- AB 2292 authored by Assemblywoman Cecilia Aguiar-Curry establishes the California Child Care Initiative Project
- SB 826 authored by State Senators Toni Atkins and Hannah-Beth
 Jackson mandates women on corporate Boards of Directors
- AB 2342 authored by Assemblywoman Autumn Burke requires coverage for breast and ovarian cancer susceptibility screening
- AB 2289 authored by Assemblywomen Shirley Weber and Lorena
 Gonzales Fletcher entitles pregnant and parenting students to 8 weeks
 of parental leave
- SB 982 authored by State Senator Holly Mitchell reinstates the annual cost of living adjustments to CALWORKS

For Public Safety:

 AB 1994 authored by Assemblywoman Sabrina Cervantes reduces the time by which a change of address for sex offenders must be reported to law enforcement

- AB 3129 authored by Assemblywoman Blanca Rubio imposes a lifetime ban on firearm possession for anyone convicted of a serious domestic violence offense
- SB 1200 authored by State Senator Nancy Skinner eliminates filing fees related to obtaining a gun violence restraining order
- AB 1877 authored by Assemblywoman Monique Limón enables disaster-related emergency communication in the most commonly spoken language other than English




